



FACULTY JOB OPENING INTERNATIONAL HISTORY/ HISTORY OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

The History Department of Sciences Po Paris invites applications for a full-time tenured professorship (French public employment status), specializing in international history or history of international relations.

RESEARCH AND TEACHING PROFIL

Research interests and work of the candidate may be on any or several aspects of international history of the 19th and/or 20th century: history of international relations, history of international society, history of international organizations, etc. A historian by training, the candidate should have proven interdisciplinary interests in fields such as political science, sociology, law, or anthropology, to continue Sciences Po's strong multidisciplinary tradition.

Candidates should demonstrate distinction in their fields. The candidate may be of French or foreign nationality, but should also have an important international dimension in his/her research. Fluency in English is a requirement. The capacity to manage international cooperation for the benefit of researchers and students, and the proven ability to obtain external funding open to students and post-doctoral researchers will also be considered favorably. Likewise, international experience through fellowships or visiting professorships in foreign universities will be a plus.

TEACHING AND RESEARCH CONDITIONS

The professor will dispense the majority of his teaching in the Department of History. He/she should be prepared to teach the history of international relations at the undergraduate level (*Collège universitaire de Sciences Po*), which can take place in Paris or in the regional campuses in Nancy, Dijon, Reims, Menton, Poitiers and Le Havre. Moreover, he/she will be fully involved in graduate training and Ph.D. supervision. For research activities, the candidate will be affiliated with the *Centre d'Histoire de Sciences Po* (see the CHSP website: <http://chsp.sciences-po.fr/>).

APPLICATION

Interested candidates should contact Professor **Marc Lazar** (marc.lazar@sciences-po.fr), head of the History Department, by sending an application letter, CV, and information about the publication record electronically.

The position will be publically advertised in March 2012 and will follow the application procedure of the French government. Foreign candidates or candidates who are not qualified by the *Conseil National des Universités* need to obtain the recognition of their equivalent status by the *Conseil scientifique* of Sciences Po. In order to do so, they should **get in contact with the History Department by 24 February 2012**. Once the job opening is officially advertised by the French Ministry of Higher Education and Research in March, the candidates will have one month to submit their application online through the "Galaxie" platform.
